





(un)common: above the ordinary; remarkable; exceptional.



Lives changed in Baptism





In 2016 nearly 400 children were involved in Upward Sports. These children got to hear about God's love on the soccer field, on the basketball court and during each cheer practice. This does not end with these kids. The ripple effect of the program

extends to their siblings, parents, grandparents and other family members and friends. Literally, thousands hear about the good news of Jesus each week.

Did you know that about 70 teens show up on Legacy's campus each Wednesday evening? They are fed a meal (that is provided by volunteers), play games, learn from the Bible and have small group time. Most of these teenagers have little church background and are hearing truths from Scripture for the very first time.



29% youth & children's ministry

19% hospitality
