Strategic Reopening Outline

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Step 1: Define Parameters

- 1. Identify resources
 - a. City, state, and federal guidance
 - b. City, county, and state case counts and trends
 - i. Count total and active cases
 - ii. What are the criteria and levels of community spread?
 - c. Trends for surrounding areas
 - i. Neighboring counties
 - ii. Across state borders as applicable
- 2. Define Terms
 - a. Risk
 - i. What is risk?
 - ii. Who, in your church and community, are most at-risk?
 - 1. Homeless, English as Second Language, poor, transient, 60+, < 18 yrs, immune-suppressed, etc.
 - b. Spread
 - i. Droplet v. Aerosol
 - ii. Community; human-to-human; touch
 - iii. How long can Coronavirus live on various surfaces?
 - c. 14-day downward trend
 - i. 14 consecutive days?
 - ii. Day 14 is lower than Day 1, and it doesn't matter what happened between?
 - d. Physical distancing (be consistent!)
 - i. 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 ft? Pick one, and that's your distance for all things.

Step 2: Key Community Partners (what are they doing/recommending? What are their resources/needs?)

- 1. City, County, State, and Tribal Health Departments
- 2. Local Government
- 3. Local Healthcare
 - a. Hospitals
 - b. Ambulance/Emergency Services
 - c. Long-term care facilities
- 4. Other churches and community organizations

Step 3: Define Trigger Points (what do you do if things get worse/better/remain the same?)

- 1. Congregational survey
 - a. Lifeway Survey <u>https://factsandtrends.net/2020/04/22/what-your-church-must-know-before-reopening-your-building/</u> (Also see bottom of page)
 - b. How informed/scared/engaged/resistant is your congregation/community?
- 2. Define non-negotiables => what are you NOT willing to risk?
- 3. Community indicators (What are restaurants, city buildings, parks, etc doing?)
- 4. When and how often do we review?
 - a. Create a decision timeline

Step 4: Protocols

- 1. Safety & Mitigation
 - a. Major questions to ask:
 - i. Who wears, cleans, and enforces?
 - ii. What are consequences for non-compliance?
 - iii. How will we accommodate? What is within our purview?
 - iv. How do we enforce these protocols?
 - v. Are these a part of our non-negotiables?
 - b. Basic things to consider:
 - i. Masks and face covers
 - ii. Gloves
 - iii. Communion
 - 1. Process
 - 2. Materials/implements
 - iv. Baptism
 - v. Offering
 - vi. Flow of traffic in space
 - vii. Spacing (this is where distance comes into play)
 - viii. Greeting rituals
 - 1. Do you have someone outside to greet to help people navigate new set up?
 - 2. How do you ensure people don't hug/high five/etc one another?
 - ix. Singing
 - 1. Aerosol spray isn't protected with masks and lingers longer in the air than droplets
 - x. Choirs of any kind
 - 1. Who washes the robes and the gloves?
 - xi. How many staff and volunteers? Who does screening?
 - xii. Training and education
 - 1. Proper mask application and removal
 - 2. Proper glove use and removal
 - xiii. Coffee and fellowship
 - xiv. Hand sanitizing stations
 - 1. Who sanitizes the sanitizer buttons?
 - xv. Having separate protocols for:
 - 1. Ushers/greeters
 - 2. Money counters
 - 3. Musicians of any kind
 - 4. Liturgist
 - 5. Preacher (if everyone is masked, are you masked?)

2. Sanitizing & Cleaning

- a. Cleaning schedule
- b. Who cleans, what do they wear, who enforces, what are consequences of non-compliance?
- c. Documentation of when and what things are cleaned
- d. Proper cleaning equipment and training
 - i. EPA approved cleaners found here: <u>https://www.epa.gov/pesticide-registration/list-n-disinfectants-use-against-sars-cov-2</u>

- ii. Sitting time of disinfectants is CRUCIAL!
- e. Training and education around proper cleaning techniques
 - i. New rag/wipe for every new surface (can't use same wipe for every light switch)
- 3. Response to exposure in the church
 - a. What do you do?
 - b. Who do you contact?
 - c. Who contacts you?
- 4. Alternatives & Suggestions
 - a. What other worship options do you provide? Who should use these services? (i.e. if you're at-risk please use online worship until [blank date])
 - b. Abundant communication through multiple channels
 - c. Signage around building of protocols, what's been done, and gentle reminders
- Step 5: Create a multi-tiered plan
 - 1. Red, Yellow, Green plans a la Iowa Annual Conference

Step 6: Practice with Leadership

- 1. Run your plan with leadership to find any adjustments of what is feasible for you and your church
- 2. If any issues arise, rewrite the plan run another practice exercise on a different day

Step 7: Praise Jesus!

Other questions to consider:

- Traffic/walking patterns within your facility
 - \circ Are people passing through multiple rooms to get to the bathroom?
 - Do people have to touch multiple door handles to get to where they need to go?
 - Are there areas people are prone to congregate in?
- Who enforces what?
- What are the consequences of non-compliance at any point in your plan?
