<u>Ihanktonwan Community College</u> Marty, SD (Yankton Reservation)

It has five associate degrees and three bachelor's degrees. The Business Management Bachelor's lets students choose between Business Management, Tribal Management, Legal Studies, and Accounting.

<u>Lower Brule Community College</u> Lower Brule, SD (Lower Brule Reservation)

Their GED (General Equivalency Diploma) Program prepares students who have not graduated from traditional high school for college study.

Oglala Lakota Community College Kyle, SD (Pine Ridge Reservation)

It has nine sites or "college centers" on the Pine Ridge, one in Eagle Butte, and one in Rapid City. The Rapid City site has 450 students and serves both Native and non-Native students.

Sinte Gleska University Mission, SD (Rosebud Reservation)

Their Entrepreneur Center is a developing business incubator. Their main focus is to help new entrepreneurs fulfill their aspirations of business ownership as well as assisting established business to explore opportunities to help expand and remain competitive in any ways they can.

<u>Sisseton-Wahpeton College</u> Sisseton, SD (Sisseton-Wahpeton Reservation)

It has an average enrollment of 250 students, 80% of whom are tribal members. New programs being developed are in Paralegal Studies and Indigenous Community Advocacy.

Sitting Bull College

Fort Yates, ND (Standing Rock Reservation)
The Master of Science in Environmental
Science Program continues to support
impactful research rooted in community and
environmental stewardship. Three graduate
students have recently earned fellowships to
research air quality related projects,
underlining their commitment to
environmental justice on the Standing Rock
Reservation and throughout North and South
Dakota.

<u>Cankdeska Cikana Community College</u> Fort Totten, ND (Spirit Lake Reservation)

The Associate of Arts degree in Indigenous Studies provides core courses that introduce students to Native culture, history, language and values while increasing understanding of the unique political status, rights and responsibilities of tribal nations.

Nueta Hidatsa Sahnish College New Town, ND (Fort Berthold Reservation)

It has kept a record of its economic impact on the reservation. In fiscal year 2022-23, the college added \$19.7 million in income to the Fort Berthold Indian Reservation economy. Expressed in terms of jobs, the college's impact supported 216 jobs.

<u>Turtle Mountain College</u> Belcourt, ND (Turtle Mountain Reservation)

Their Regional Substance Abuse Prevention Project and the Partnership for Success Project (Underage Drinking Prevention) work to implement prevention strategies in areas such as policy development, alcohol taxation, enforcement efforts, coalition building, and drug & alcohol related data collection. Efforts are underway to collect meth use data to enable the project to focus on meth prevention.

<u>United Tribes Technical College</u> Bismarck, ND

The college is located on the former site of Fort Lincoln, which was built in 1900-1910, and served as a Japanese Internment Camp in World War II. It was referred to by the Japanese as the "Snow Country Prison." Through a combined effort by the tribes and Japanese Americans, a memorial is currently being built that will include a memorial wall, a healing garden, and a 4-directions drum circle.
