(Take time to breathe.)


When you are ready, stand up and look for a way to walk outside a little. Perhaps there is a path, or a way to meander in this green space.

Amen.






In Praise of the Forest



of God.



About the prayer "A Prayer for Ethiopia":

As the writer calls for prayer, so we must also call for
action. Ethiopia and East Africa are among the most
vulnerable places in the planet for the effects of the
climate crisis. The people in these countries have had
little to no part in the growing problems of oil and gas
pollution, and yet they have disproportionately suffered
from the effects.

Catastrophic flooding in Ethiopia and East Africa is
now all too common an occurrence. As the author writes
this prayer, Ethiopia and East Africa are again under
floodwaters with hundreds of thousands of people
displaced, including refugees from South Sudan who
are sheltering in Ethiopia from drought and civil conflict
in their homeland.

Flooding is happening on a bigger scale and more
often in places around the globe, such as Indonesia,
