SLAUGHTER OF THE INNOCENTS

"A voice was heard in Ramah, wailing and loud lamentation, Rachel weeping for her children; she refused to be consoled, because they were no more."

~ Matthew 2:18, NRSV

Matthew's Gospel quotes the prophecy of Jeremiah in reporting that King Herod killed all the male children in the region of Bethlehem who were two years old or under in his misguided, rage-induced and evil attempt to eliminate Jesus.

It is time to lay aside the politics of mental health care and gun control and come together to protect our children and youth. It is time to cease the slaughter of the innocents.

I encourage you to continue praying for the victims of Friday's shooting. Every first responder, surviving teacher and student, family member, and citizen of the Newton community is a victim. As you pray for those whose lives have been forever altered, pray also for an end to violence in our schools, streets, across our nation and around the world.

May the truth and power of Christ's coming give us hope in this tragic hour.
