You Should Know the Facts

Every 15 seconds, a child in the U.S. is abused or neglected, totaling 2 million children per year.

- Child sexual abuse can happen in our church.
- © One incident can devastate a child, a family, and our church.
- The legal liabilities can be enormous.
- Church leaders may be held liable for damages.
- ② A prevention program can reduce the risk through relatively simple procedures.
- It is estimated that 1 in 3 adult women and 1 in 7 adult men have been abused before the age of 18.

What National Experts Say

Sexual molestation poses the greatest risk facing the church today. Since 1984, hundreds of cases have gone to court with jury verdicts as high as \$10 million.

Sexual misconduct seems to be one of the most volatile issues in America's churches. Insurance coverage for sexual abuse is weak or nonexistent in most churches. Every church needs to take action to protect its members: young and old. Three churches a day file insurance claims; one of every three is for sexual abuse.
