




Haiti has lost 98 percent of its forest cover—erosion, landslides and catastrophic lowland flooding result. Virtually everyone in Haiti burns wood or charcoal

for cooking. Many Haitians without jobs collect wood to make charcoal. Burning remaining wood to produce charcoal makes this practice unsustainable.

Replace smoky charcoal fires with healthy and safe solar cooking.

Smoke from a charcoal cooking fire is the equivalent of smoking two packs of cigarettes per day. Women who cook with charcoal and young children standing near them suffer burns, respiratory and eye diseases.



Money spent for charcoal can now buy more food. Anything can be cooked in a solar oven including meats, rice and vegetables. Solar ovens bake bread—not possible over charcoal fires and grates.

Few Haitian households have access to potable water. With a solar oven, a family can pasteurize water, killing dangerous microbes that cause life-threatening illness, especially in children.

Our Goal: Deliver 2,300 solar ovens including cooking pots & bread pans plus hands-on training to Haitian families every year.
